

Overview of Drownings and Major Injuries* Recorded for the First Week of July (Canada Day)
Years 2002-2004

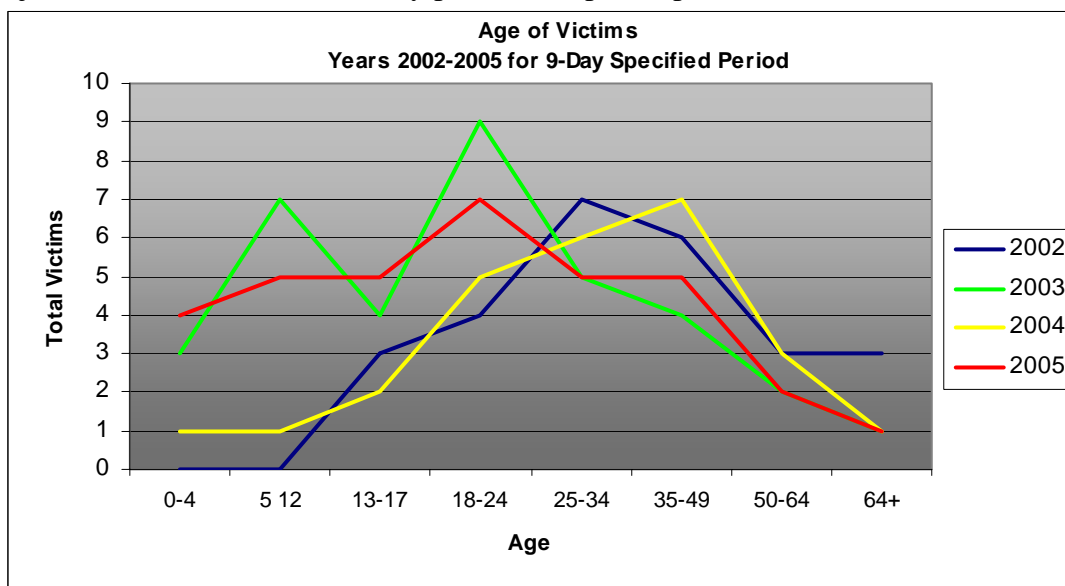
- ✚ 2002 Figures – 28/06/02 to 06/07/02
 - There were 26 incidents recorded for this 9-day period
 - Ratio of female to male victims was 1:4.2
 - Of the 26 recorded incidents for the 9-day period specified above, 21 incidents were fatal; 5 were major injuries requiring hospitalization
 - There were 18 boating related incidents; 7 in-water aquatic and 1 non-aquatic incident

- ✚ 2003 Figures – 28/06/03 to 06/07/03
 - There were 35 incidents recorded for this 9-day period
 - Ratio of female to male victims was 1:3
 - Of the 35 recorded incidents for the 9-day period specified above, 28 incidents were fatal; 7 were major injuries requiring hospitalization
 - There were 19 in-water aquatic incidents; 9 non-aquatic incidents and 7 boating incidents

- ✚ 2004 Figures – 25/06/04 to 03/07/04
 - There were 26 incidents recorded for this 9-day period
 - Ratio of female to male victims was 1:4.2
 - Of the 26 recorded incidents for the 9-day period specified above, 18 incidents were fatal; 8 were major injuries requiring hospitalization
 - There were 14 boating incidents; 6 in-water aquatic incidents and 6 non-aquatic incidents

- ✚ 2005 Figures – 01/07/05 to 09/07/05
 - There were 34 incidents recorded for this 9-day period
 - Ratio of female to male victims was 1:3.9
 - Of the 34 recorded incidents for the 9-day period specified above, 30 incidents were fatal; 4 were major injuries requiring hospitalization
 - There were 15 in-water aquatic incidents; 12 boating related incidents and 7 non-aquatic incidents

For all years indicated above, lakes and rivers were the most frequent location recorded for water-related injuries and fatalities followed by private and public pools.
